

## Joshua 6:1-27 Discussion

1. What does God's declaration in Joshua 6:2 ("I have given Jericho into your hand") teach us about His sovereignty and faithfulness to His promises?
2. Why do you think God chose such an unconventional method for conquering Jericho instead of a traditional military strategy? What does this reveal about His character?
3. How does Israel's willingness to march around the city day after day demonstrate genuine faith and obedience?
4. Can you identify a time in your life when God called you to obey Him before you could see the outcome? What did you learn from that experience?
5. What are some "walls" believers commonly face today (spiritual, emotional, relational, or circumstantial), and how does this passage encourage us to trust God with them?
6. Joshua 6 emphasizes God's power rather than Israel's strength. Why is it important for believers to recognize that spiritual victories ultimately come from God and not from themselves?
7. What does Rahab's rescue teach us about God's grace, mercy, and willingness to save people regardless of their background or past?
8. How does Rahab's faith point forward to the gospel and God's plan of salvation through Jesus Christ?
9. What lessons can we learn from Joshua's warning concerning Jericho about God's holiness and the seriousness of obeying His commands?
10. We concluded by connecting Jericho's fallen walls to Christ's work on the cross. In what ways has Jesus demolished barriers between God and humanity, and how should that impact the way we live today?
