9. What was the purpose of casting lots in the Bible? How can contemporary believers discern God's will?
10. Why do you think Joshua received his territory last? What kind of leadership has Joshua shown throughout the book?
11. What promises have been given to believers that we have yet to possess?
12. Dan abandoned its assigned territory and pursued a place that appeared easier to conquer. Where are we tempted to choose what is manageable instead of what God has commanded?
13. In what ways can understanding our inheritance in Christ shape our spiritual journey and identity?
14. Is there something God has clearly commanded you to do that you have been delaying? What reasons or excuses have contributed to that delay?
